

Alameda County Opioid Innovative Mini-Grant Recipients

The Alameda County Board of Supervisors has selected Three Valleys Community Foundation (3VCF) to fiscally manage and administer \$3 million dollars in Opioid Settlement Innovative Mini-Grant Program funds. Working closely with Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Department (ACBHD), 3VCF is investing available resources in county-wide organizations serving individuals and communities that provide access to and prevention treatment for opioid addiction and overdose reversal remedies.

Bay Area One Health Coalition

To address the mental health and substance use challenges in the Tri-Valley by integrating Project Pet animal-assisted therapy, holistic wellness approaches, and culturally competent wrap-around services, working with the One Health mode

Black Girls Mental Health Collective Foundation

To support the BIRTH Network to integrate perinatal mental health care with opioid remediation strategies, addressing the intersecting challenges of substance use disorders (SUD) and maternal health disparities; to train birth workers while expanding services to vulnerable youth and incarcerated individuals

California Prevention and Education Project (CAL-PEP)

To support Project MOST to evaluate the effectiveness of a fully street-based opioid treatment program, aiming to enhance engagement and improve outcomes for unhoused individuals receiving treatment for opioid use disorder (OUD)

City of Fremont Human Services To support City of Fremont's Mobile Evaluation Team (MET), a field based collaboration with Fremont Police Department, to decrease repeat emergency care visits, psychiatric inpatient hospitalizations, and continued involvement with law enforcement among unsheltered residents with substance use issues

To support the East Oakland Opioid Response Initiative to expand access to opioid addiction treatment, harm reduction, and recovery support for marginalized communities, through mobile MAT, naloxone distribution, and culturally responsive care

Tha Town To expand, train and develop Junior Journalist Opioid Outreach to produce articles, podcast and videos highlighting the opioid crisis across Alameda County in collaboration with Pleasanton Weekly and Embarcadero Media Foundation; to revitalize local journalism and connect with vulnerable youth with peer-generated content to reduce and prevent opioid abuse county-wide

Tri-Valley Haven To achieve significant improvements in the support provided to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault who are struggling with substance abuse, particularly opioid addiction, by focusing on enhanced client outcomes, improved staff ability, and strengthened community collaboration

Trybe, Inc. To support the Trybe Safe Spaces Project that positively develops and empowers youth by meeting them where they are, engaging effectively through trusted mentors, and addressing obstacles like trauma, violence, and basic needs; to reduce substance abuse through preventative measures by providing healthy alternatives

West Oakland Punks With Lunch To support Harm reduction, Education and Access to naloxone for safer Lives (HEAL) Oakland, a four-pronged approach to engage and uplift the voices of drug users through increased naloxone distribution, peer counseling, innovative educational materials and a community advisory board in order to end the overdose crisis

Youth Uprising To support A Push Forward, an innovative, youth-centered initiative designed to combat the opioid epidemic in Alameda County through a multifaceted approach focusing on Prevention, Intervention, and Awareness



This innovative initiative, in keeping with 3VCF's mantra of "Give, Grant and Grow" is an actionable extension of the "Give Where You Live" concept. The 2025 campaign, intended to be conducted annually going forward, will be tailored to energize and mobilize local giving, bolstering the hundreds of nonprofits serving communities throughout the inland areas of Alameda and Contra Costa Counties. The 925 area code covers a unique geographic region that encompasses 23 cities, 998,665 households, and services a population of approximately 2.848,280 individuals¹

Moving from Transactional to Transformational with the Power of Investment

3VCF works with Fremont Bank to professionally invest the charitable assets of our fundholders to achieve a competitive rate of return. Our Foundation enjoys a special arrangement with Fremont Bank, enabling donors and nonprofits of any size to access the Bank's professional investment services at a more competitive rate. Fremont Bank does this by pooling assets together into different investment pools.

Investment Pool Options for 3VCF Fundholders

Capital Preservation / Cash Management Pool Fund:

The strategy prioritizes principal stability, with income generation as a secondary objective. Currently, funds are allocated to a money market fund to maintain liquidity. Future allocations may include high-quality bonds to enhance yield while preserving capital.

Balanced Pool Fund: The fund follows a balanced asset allocation approach to seek portfolio growth, income, and stability. Investments combine active and passive strategies diversified across equity, fixed income, and alternative investments to optimize risk-adjusted returns and enhance portfolio resilience.

Balanced Socially Responsible Investment (SRI) Pool Fund: The fund follows a balanced asset allocation approach to provide growth, income, and stability, optimizing risk-adjusted returns and enhancing portfolio resilience. The strategy prioritizes investments that exhibit positive environmental, social, and governance characteristics.

Growth Pool Fund: The strategy emphasizes the growth of the principal by allocating 80% to 100% to global equity markets. It uses a mix of individual U.S. large-cap stocks and low-cost equity ETFs across the mid-cap, small-cap, and international equity space to achieve broad diversification and long-term capital appreciation.

Our Foundation's "Power of Three" extends to oversight, transparency and trust. Our Investment Committee regularly reviews fund performance and policies. We also actively seek input on best practices from financial leaders in our region via our Professional Advisors Network (PAN).


